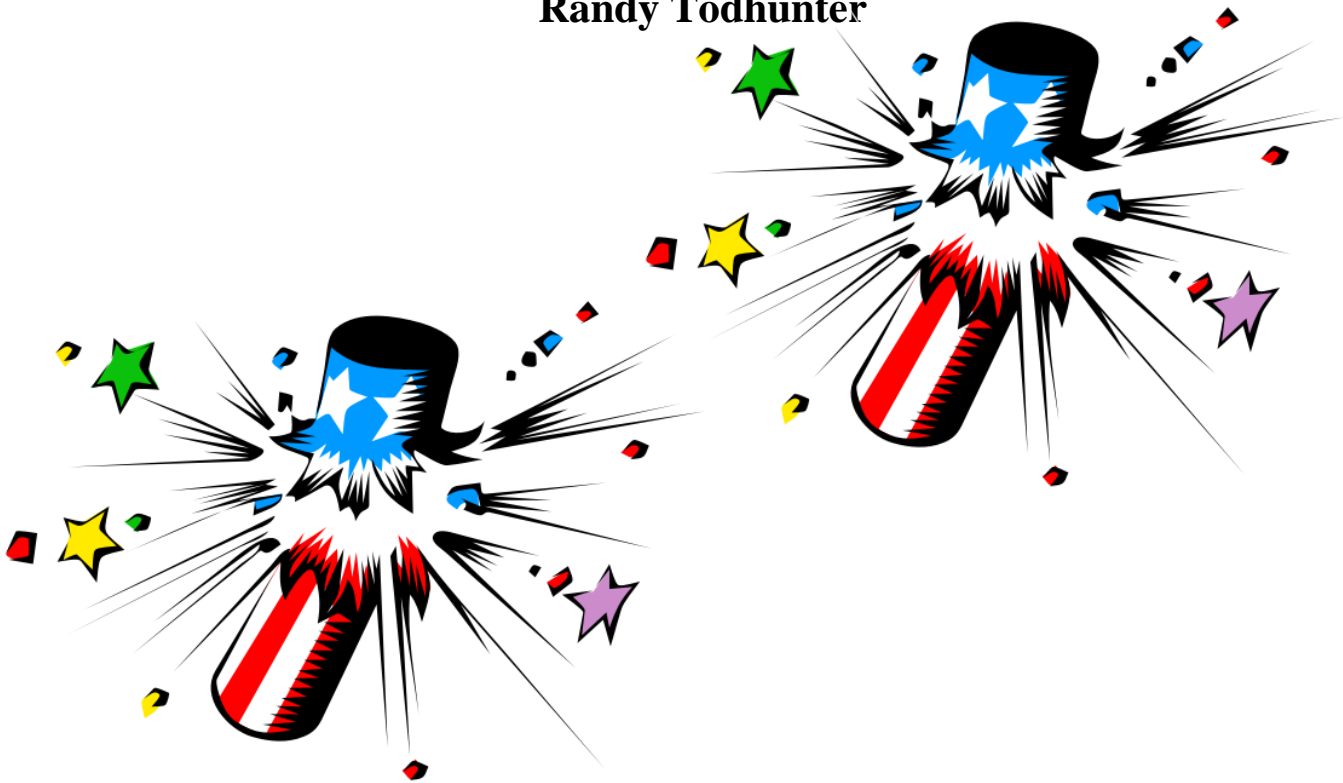

Answers to RCC President's trivia

- (1) Flint, Michigan, 1953. It moved to saint Louis in 1954.
- (2) 1975. The convertible option returned in the 1986 C4.
- (3) 1978. That was the 25th anniversary year. 6,502 replicas were made, one per dealership.
- (4) \$2,744, in 1954 and 1955.
- (5) Corvettes were originally small, very maneuverable convoy escorts during WW2.
- (6) Only one choice. Polo white with a red interior and a black convertible top.
- (7) 1963, with the introduction of the C2 split window coupe. All C1's were convertibles.
- (8) The LT1 package. It was only available in 1970-1972.
- (9) 1983. Supposedly 43 were built. 42 were destroyed in testing or by crushing. One 1983 still exists and is in the NCR collection.
